June 12, 2017	Payment must be received in the office by 5:00 p.m. to avoid disconnection for May 1, 2017 bill
June 13, 2017	Disconnection date for May 1, 2017 bill
June 15, 2017	Due Date for June 1, 2017 bill
June 20, 2017	Disconnection Notice mailed for June 1, 2017 bill
June 26, 2017	Payment must be received in the office by 5:00 p.m. to avoid penalty for June 1, 2017 bill

- Bills are mailed on the 1st business day of each month.
- Bills are due upon receipt and are considered late if not paid by the due date indicated on the bill.
- A late fee will be applied to the account if the payment is not received in our office or online by 5:00 pm on the due date indicated on the bill.
- Water service is subject to immediate disconnection if payment in full is not received in the office or online at www.PPHCSD.org by 5:00 pm on the due date indicated on the Disconnection Notice.

The Drought is Over. What Now?

The governor has declared an end to the drought. However, water conservation regulations have not gone away. The state has issued Executive Order B-37-16, requiring a permanent prohibition of wasteful water practices, including:

- Hosing off sidewalks, driveways and other hardscapes;
- Washing automobiles with hoses not equipped with a shut off nozzle;
- Using non-recirculated water in a fountain or other decorative water feature;
- Watering lawns in a manner that causes runoff, or within 48 hours after measureable precipitation.

In order to comply with the new permanent prohibitions, the District will remain in Stage II of its water conservation requirements at this time. All customers must still comply with these requirements.

Conservation is a Way of Life

The desert area in which we live is not stranger to drought conditions. We have dry, arid soil and typically do not experience precipitation levels that other areas do. We have made great strides in reducing our water consumption and protecting our precious local water resources over the past 40 years. Conservation has been our way of life and we must continue this lifestyle if we are to have the resources necessary to carry us into the future and survive prolonged drought events.
